# Linsteadt Vineyard

AMADOR COUNTY



Among the pioneers who introduced Sangiovese to the New World, the Gullett family is renowned for making "California's Best Sangiovese." In 1985, they set out with the singular goal of making Vino Noceto California's premiere Sangiovese producer. From just three producing acres and 110 cases in their inaugural 1990 vintage, they now farm over 25 acres and produce 10,000 cases per year, including ten different Sangioveses, a frizzante Moscato, and old vine Zinfandel, and Barbera.

Barbera, the third-most planted red grape in Italy, is one of California's most up-and-coming grape varietals. The Linsteadt Barbera is known as a food-friendly, approachable wine. It is full-bodied with good acid and structure, soft, silky tannins, and a long finish.

### **VINEYARDS**

The Linsteadt Vineyard, located in the Shenandoah Valley, CA, has been in the Linsteadt family for three generations. Don and MaryLou Linsteadt originally planted Barbera in the late 80's, and then replanted in 1994 with Clone 6 of Barbera, known for producing a full-bodied, rustic, old-world Barbera. Vino Noceto receives these grapes for its Barbera.

# WINEMAKING

The fruit was cold soaked for 2 days followed by a 16-day submerged-cap fermentation in stainless steel tanks, at 54°-70° F, which favors a fruit-forward, gentle extraction of flavors. Aged 19 months in French oak barrels, 25% new.

# THE WINE

Displaying bright, yet ripe, blueberry and raspberry fruit, a touch of spice, and just the right amount of acid to make it all balance, this offering is a perfect example of what makes Sierra foothill Barberas so exceptional.

Components: 98.5% Barbera, 1% Alicante Bouschet, .5% Teroldego
